



## Information on the Thematic Groups

### Children & Young People

The Surrey Alliance for Children, Young People & Families, brings together services for children and young people in Surrey and has shared leadership and collective responsibility for improving outcomes for children, young people, and families

Agencies within the Alliance will come together, aligning priorities and resources to realise the following benefits:

- Better outcomes for children, young people and families
- Consistency in access and provision across the County
- Maximum value for money

### Economic Development

The role of the thematic partnerships is to:

- Provide strategic direction within the economic theme and develop relevant aspects of Surrey's Community Strategy, LAA and other action plans for recommendation to the SSP Leadership Group, taking into account the needs of Surrey's communities, workforce and businesses in the context of the theme and the work of the other theme partnerships and influencing the operational plans of partners where necessary.
- Co-ordinate and performance manage delivery of the relevant elements of Surrey's Community Strategy, and LAA and other partnership priorities and targets against the theme plans, holding sub groups and partners to account.
- Communicate the priorities, activities and achievements of the partnership to the public and across the wider SSP.

### Health and Well-being

The role of the Health and Well-Being Partnership is to oversee delivery of particular priorities for Surrey as incorporated within the Surrey Local Area Agreement and the Surrey Sustainable Community Strategy. It will do this by providing strategic leadership and direction; managing performance; monitoring existing and developing new delivery arrangements; and driving through joint planning and service development to improve outcomes for the population of Surrey, especially those who experience or are vulnerable to ill-health and / or social exclusion. It will pay special regard to equality and diversity issues. It will report and be accountable to the Surrey Strategic Partnership Board.

## **Housing, Infrastructure and Environment**

The partnership board is a forum for progressing the Housing, Infrastructure and Environment agenda for Surrey, as part of the Surrey Strategic Partnership.

The partnership seeks to develop the effective protection, maintenance and improvement of Surrey's natural and built environment, with specific consideration to the role of housing, transport, climate change, waste, water efficiency and energy. The partnership, where possible, will support initiatives designed to affect attitudinal / behavioural change towards measures tackling climate change. In addition, the partnership will keep abreast of the cross cutting themes of economic development in respect of managing the physical impact of economic growth.

## **Safer and Stronger Communities**

The Safer and Stronger Communities Partnership Board is the countywide body that brings together all key partners to provide strategic leadership in the delivery of safe and strong communities in the county.

### **Aim & Purpose**

The role of the Safer & Stronger Communities Partnership Board (SSCPB) is to ensure a strong and effective partnership approach to creating safe and strong communities in the county.

The SSCPB will report to the Surrey Strategic Partnership as one of its 5 thematic groupings on all issues relating to safer and stronger communities. The SSCPB will make recommendations to the SSP for the direction and delivery of safer and stronger communities programmes for the county.

The SSCPB will formulate safer and stronger aspects of Surrey's Community Strategy and Local Area Agreement for consideration by the SSP.

The SSCPB will ensure that all Government requirements relating to countywide delivery of safe and strong communities are adhered to.
